But it was his talk "Understanding Ourselves in an Epic Universe" at the 2009 TEDx Convention in Toronto that garnered the most attention for Makepeace. The unexpected awakening or "shift in identity" he sustained from over 30 years of confronting the majesty of the universe brought with it fresh eyes – and new inspiration for his talks. Known as "the pitchman for the universe," Makepeace uses his unique perspective on our world to illustrate the powerful relationship between us and the immense forces of the universe.
